#### Volunteers

We have such an amazing parent/guardian team at our school. Many of you have been asking if you can come volunteer. The COVID-19 guidelines state, "those individuals who are supporting activities that benefit student learning and well-being are allowed in the building." As well, we need to follow cohort limits of 60. That means for example: grade 2 and 4 students, plus those adults already working in the school are included in that number of 60 if they are supporting those two classrooms. Some cohorts can only have 1 or 2 additional supports this term. Please follow up with your child's cohort teachers to see what the cohort limit is and if they can include volunteers for student learning. A Volunteer form and interview with the principal must be completed as well before supporting student learning within the classroom.
