Health & Safety Checks

Communit

Parents / caregivers are required to continue to assess their child daily for symptoms of common cold, influenza, COVID-19 or other infectious respiratory disease before sending them to school (self-assessment tool: https://bc.thrive.health/covid19/en).

If a student develops symptoms while at home, the child is to remain at home. If a child becomes ill with any **'Key Symptoms of Illness' (excluding fever)**, the child should stay home for 24 hours from when the symptom started. If the symptom improves, you may return to school when you feel well enough. If the symptom persists or worsens, seek a health assessment. The Ministry of Education has worked with Public Health and the BCCDC to create a daily health check website and mobile app that students and parents can use to complete before heading to school in the morning (https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/covid-19-safe-schools#app). Students are reminded to wash their hands before coming to school and upon arriving at school. <u>Review information on hand hygiene in a school setting</u> from the BCCDC.

Weather Conditions

Our weather has been a bit crazy lately! A reminder that all students are required to play outside at recess, and noon time, weather permitting. When the temperature is -20 C or colder with the wind chill, students will be kept inside. Please ensure your child dresses warmly. There are also days that supervisors call for inside days due to icy conditions and student safety. Please speak with your child about the importance of being prepared for outside activities each day and to wear appropriate warm winter clothing. Thank you for helping to keep everyone cozy!

After school supervision is over at 3:00pm, students must be picked up on time.



Notre Dame School is "Allergy AWARE". Please check with your child's classroom teacher for allergy alerts. Consider peanut/nut alternatives for individual student lunches and snacks out of consideration to our students and staff with food sensitivities/allergies.

Students are reminded that snacks and lunch are to be eaten in the classroom. We cannot eat recess snack or lunch on the playground for safety reasons such as allergies.





Crosswalk Safety: When having your child cross the road to meet you please encourage the students to use the crosswalk for student safety. A safety concern is that students are stepping out in front of the school bus and oncoming cars cannot see the students until they are in front of them. A crossing guard is paid and hired by the school for student safety.

Kindergarten Registration Still Underway

Notre Dame is still welcoming new Kindergarten students for the 2021-2022 school year. Any child who will be 5 years of age on or before December 31, 2021 may register. The Registration Package is available on Notre Dame's school website and at the school office. At Notre Dame, Kindergarten establishes a strong foundation for lifelong learning, as the teacher provides dynamic, play-based opportunities to help each child grow and learn. We focus on the whole child socially, emotionally, academically, and spiritually.

Once the school receives the registration package from families, interviews with new families will be set up. Interviews started the week of January 18th and will continue as registrations come into the school.
