## **Health & Safety Checks**

Parents / caregivers are required to continue to assess their child daily for symptoms of common cold, influenza, COVID-19 or other infectious respiratory disease before sending them to school (self-assessment tool: https://bc.thrive.health/covid19/en).

If a student develops symptoms while at home, the child is to remain at home. If a child becomes ill with any 'Key Symptoms of Illness' (excluding fever), the child should stay home for 24 hours from when the symptom started. If the symptom improves, you may return to school when you feel well enough. If the symptom persists or worsens, seek a health assessment. The Ministry of Education has worked with Public Health and the BCCDC to create a daily health check website and mobile app that students and parents can use to complete before heading to school in the morning (https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/covid-19-safe-schools#app).

## Hand Hygiene & Wear Masks

Students are reminded to wash their hands before coming to school and upon arriving at school. Review information on hand hygiene in a school setting from the BCCDC. Following the Provincial COVID-19 Health and Safety Guidelines for K-12 Settings: "All students in Grades 4-12 are required to wear a mask or a face shield (in which case a non-medical mask should be worn in addition to the face shield) indoors in school and on school buses both within and outside of their learning group. Please ensure your child in Grades 4-7 has a face mask with them each school day. Exceptions are made for staff and students who cannot wear a mask for medical or other reasons; please contact Mrs. Richard if this pertains to you.

#### **Dress Code**

Nice weather has arrived and this brings warmer weather! A reminder that all students at Notre Dame School are to dress appropriately for school: students are not to wear short-shorts, or bare midriffs (i.e. belly shirts), grade 4, 5, 6, and 7: tank top straps should be a minimum of two-three fingers wide and fingertips must touch the fabric of shorts/skirts when their hands are naturally at their sides.

After school supervision is over at 3:00pm, students must be picked up on time.



Registration for the 2021-22 School year is Ongoing Notre Dame is still welcoming new registrations for the 2021-2022 school year. Any child who will be 5 years of age on or before December 31, 2021 may register for Kindergarten. The Registration Package for all grades is available on Notre Dame's school website and at the school office. Once the school receives the registration package from families, interviews with new families will be set up with the principal and our school priest, Father Vener.

Notre Dame School is "Allergy AWARE". Please check with your child's classroom teacher for allergy alerts. Consider peanut/nut alternatives for individual student lunches and snacks out of consideration to our students and staff with food sensitivities/allergies.

Students are reminded that snacks and lunch are to be eaten in the classroom. We cannot eat recess snack or lunch on the playground for safety reasons such as allergies.

## **Student Safety**

Cross Walk Safety: When having your child cross the road to meet you please encourage the students to use the cross walk for student safety. A safety concern is that students and parents are stepping out in front of the school bus. Oncoming cars can not see the students until they are in front of them.

A crossing guard is paid and hired by the school for student safety. Please remind your child(rei the cross walk.

Parking continues to be closed at the beginning and end of the day for student safety. Please park along the road and walk to the gates or have your child meet you at the sidewalk. Thank you for your continued support in this safety issue.
